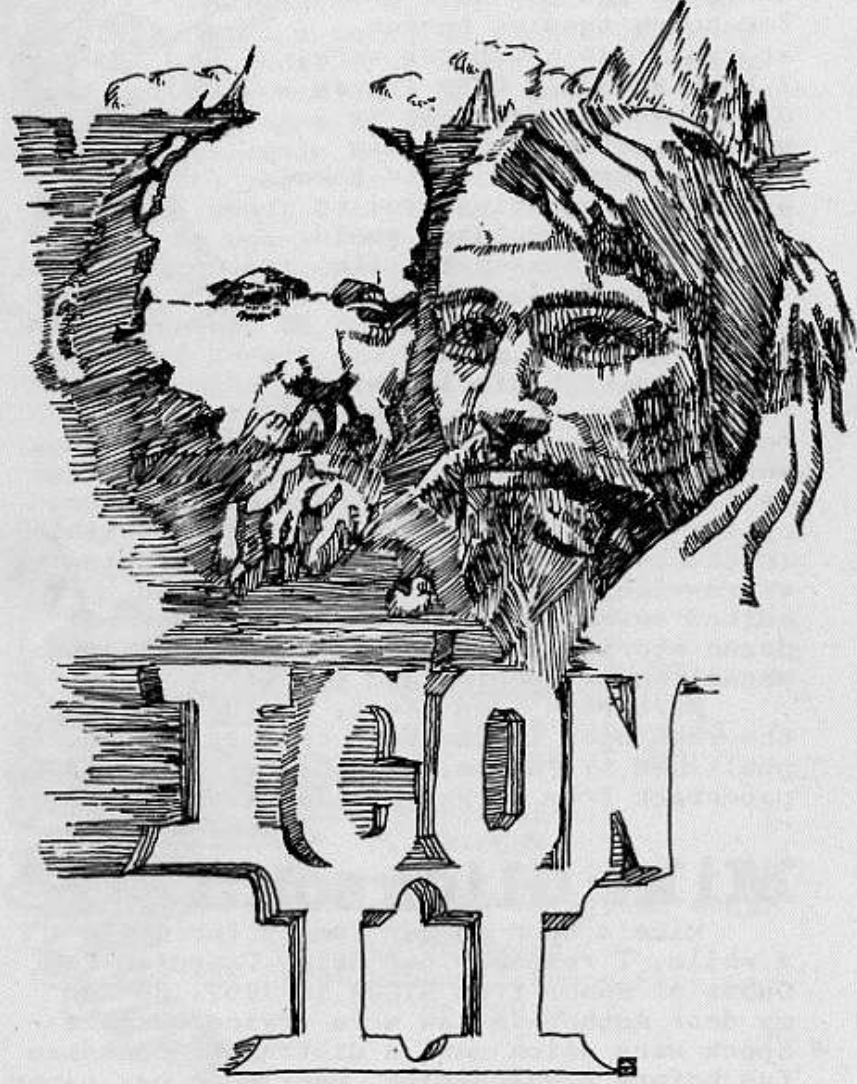

The first time I met Frank Herbert was at a small party in Los Angeles, where he and Ben Bova sat for hours trading horror stories about newspaper work. I have to admit that it was difficult to reconcile my preconceptions about this author--surely it would take a sneaky, Byzantine type to invent the convoluted world of the Bene Gesserit--with this jolly fellow who points a huge beard at the ceiling and shakes the walls with his laughter.



Herbert hasn't spent all his life behind a typewriter. Besides having been a working writer since the 50's, he's worked as a TV cameraman, radio news commentator, oyster diver, lay analyst, jungle survival instructor and teacher.* Besides writing award-winning science fiction, he had edited several newspapers and had several dozen stories published in such prestigious magazines as Esquire and Collier's.

Herbert's 22nd novel, Children of Dune, the last book in the Dune trilogy, currently published by Putnam, will be available in paperback from Berkely in January. Enjoy!

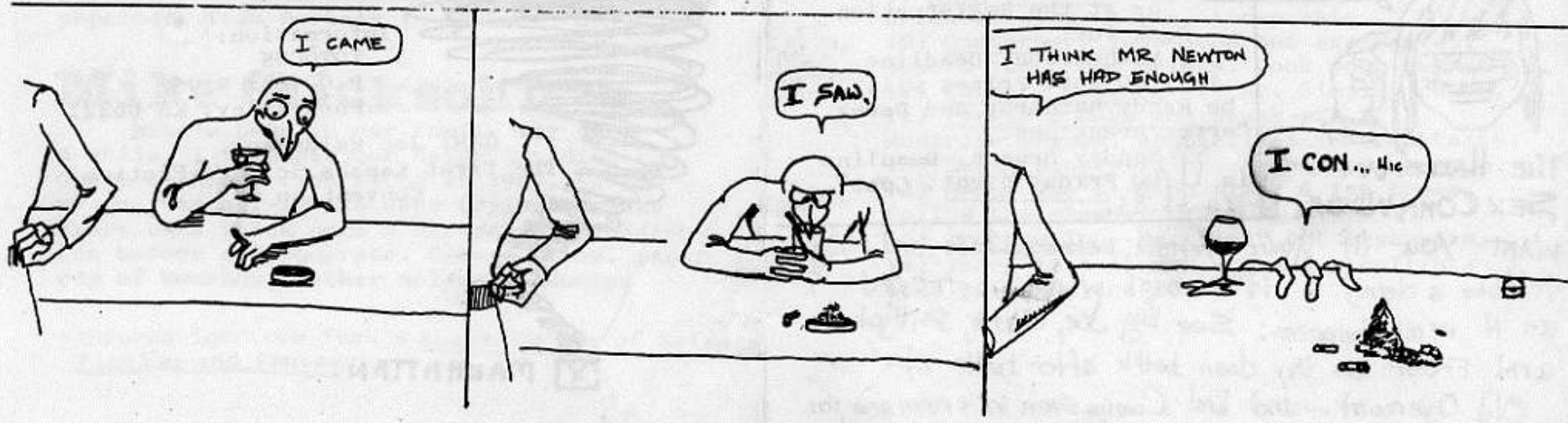

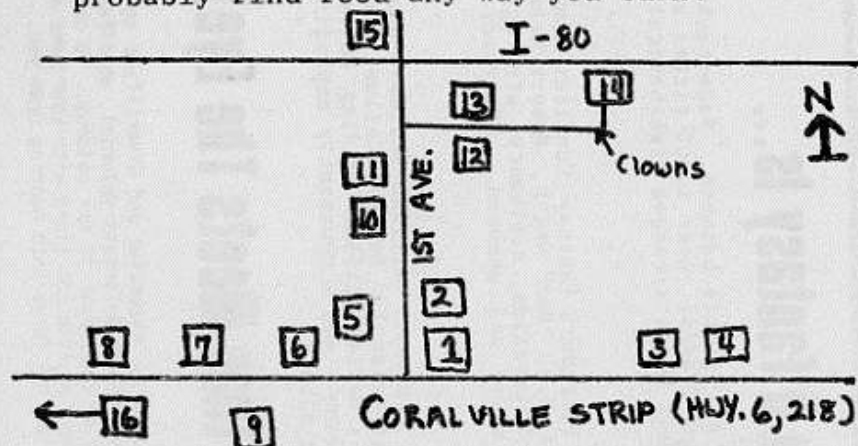
